3. Revelation is meant to give us hope that Christ is the only King who lasts. How does that truth change your thoughts about our world today? Is it hard to believe? Why or why not?
4. Why is it so easy to give ourselves to things that are transitory and momentary, and harder for us to think about things that have eternal impact? Why is it important to do?
