## **STUDY GUIDE**

The discipline of studying may take you back to high school or college, and may immediately evoke the anxiety of tests and group projects. But luckily for us, studying Scripture is so much more than memorizing the latest facts for the test. Studying is about relationship, not just scholarship. We should approach the study of Scripture in a corporate manner and a personal manner in order to learn more about Jesus and deepen our relationship with Him.

If we listen to the Word from the pulpit and study it on our own time, but it doesn't change us and challenge us to obey, then that knowledge hasn't made it from our head to our heart, and that's where it needs to live. With the Internet at our fingertips, the study of Scripture is more accessible than ever, but in the mass of information it's also easy to be led astray by popular teachings that feel good, and sound good, but frankly don't line up with Scripture. This is why corporate study and personal study are both important. We test what we study, read, and watch against Scripture, our own experience of God, and the world around us, and we also need to engage in conversations with those around us to deepen our relationship with Christ and put those words into practice in our world.
